

"I was going through a hard time and I kind of gave up on school but then I was like, 'I got to go to school. I have to go somewhere after graduation," said Yesi, whois 18 years old. "I just had to put my mindset on school and finish it for my baby."

She was referred to New Moms by her doctor and was paired with a Doula during her pregnancy and Family Support Specialist (FSS) after the birth of her son. Yesi said her FSS also helped motivate her to focus on school.

Now that she's graduated, Yesi wants to become a real estate agent and eventually own her own home. She recently started a handmade jewelry business and is saving for real estate license classes.
