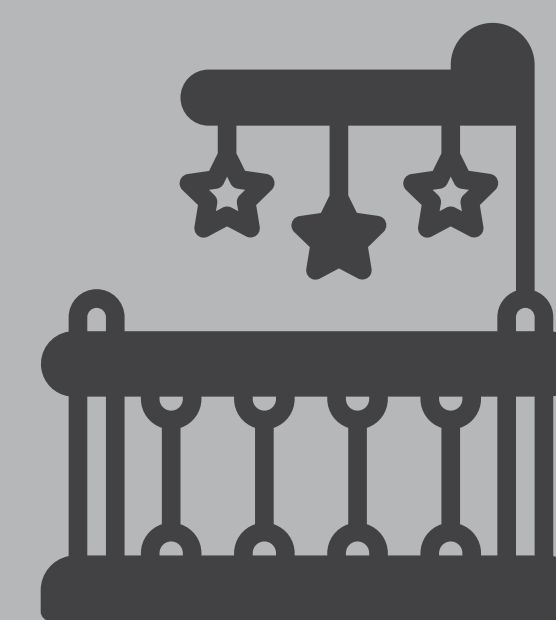

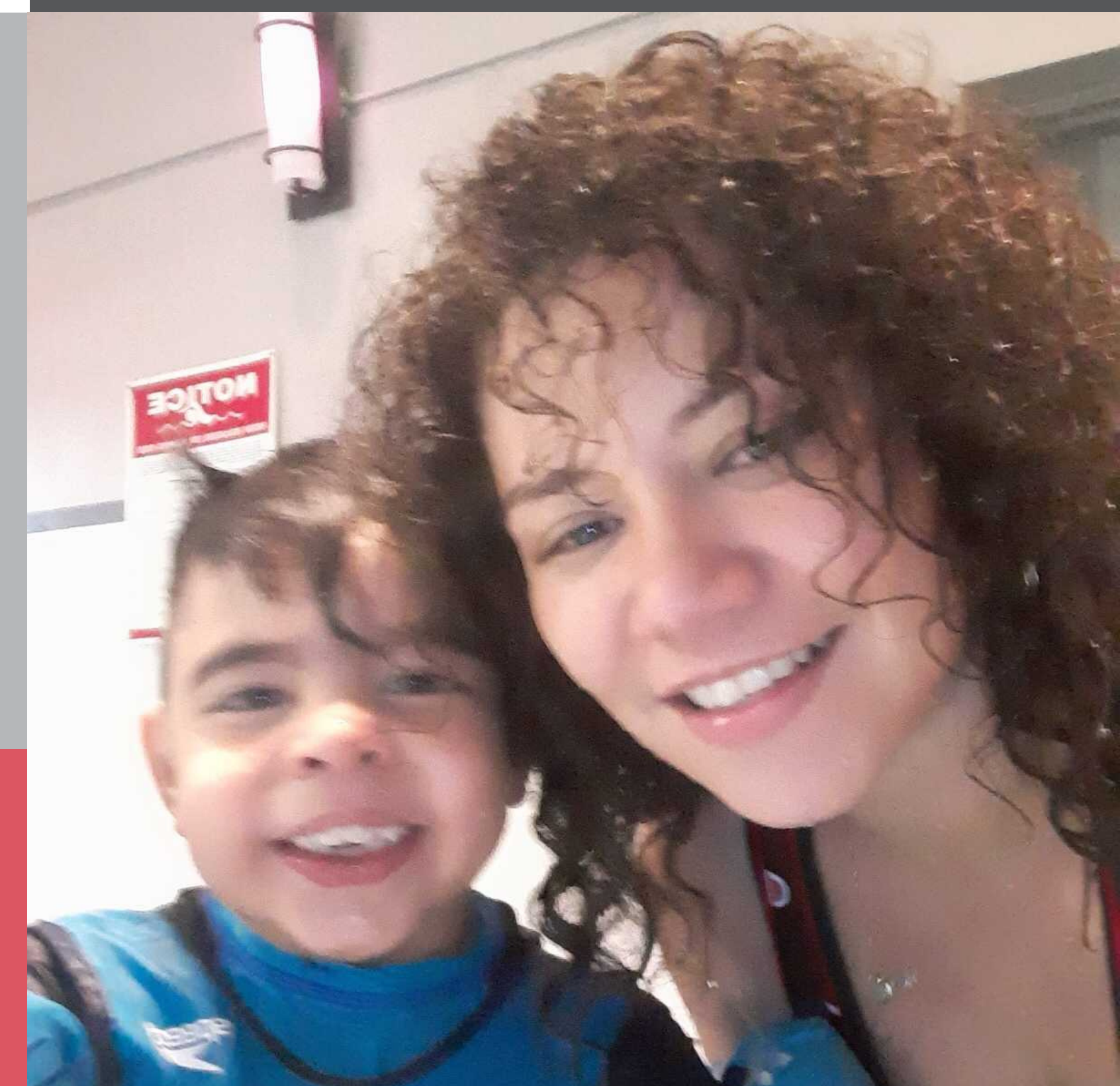
Jazmin was eight months pregnant with her second son when she moved to Chicago from Mexico. She said connecting with New Moms gave her a community to rely on and helped her get settled into a new country. “New Moms isn’t just ‘you get Pampers and wipies,’” said Jazmin, the proud mother of Jonathan (5) and Allen (3). “You can have a person to hear you and not judge you. [...] You build friendships. It makes me feel like I’m not the only one on this journey.”

Jazmin has worked with her New Moms coaches to secure housing, buy a car, and find reliable childcare so she could start a new job.

Jazmin is most proud of learning to be kind to herself during her time at New Moms and realizing that no one is a perfect parent. “I’m not the only one that struggles,” said the 26-year-old Jazmin. “You’re not a bad mom if you don’t know how to do stuff. You’re learning while you’re raising your kids.
